

Squab student packing guide

This guide forms part of our terms and conditions.

Definitions:

An item - An item is anything that one person can carry that doesn't exceed 16kg. It could be a box, a suitcase, a bike or a chair. The best way to think of it? If you can't carry it, it's probably too heavy!

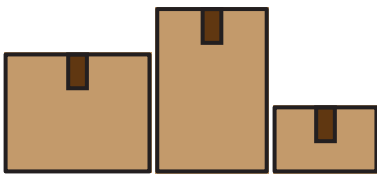
Collection address/Delivery address restrictions - We will only collect from ground or first floor. Please arrange for someone to help you move the goods down if they are above the first floor.

Labelling - Ensure that all boxes are labelled with your surname, date of collection and number each item e.g. 1 of 8, 2 of 8.

Prohibited items:

Food (of any type including tins, packets, foil wrapped), liquids (drinks, oil, cartridges), flammable items (nail varnish, cigarette lighters, lighter fluid, gas), Drugs, Perishable items (plants), Illegal items, firearms and high value items such as money, art, jewellery, antiques.

Packing guide



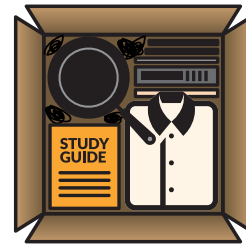
Use the appropriate box for the job

Don't overfill the boxes. Books are heavy and can easily lead to the box becoming greater than 16kg - use a smaller box.



Use strong cardboard boxes

Don't use thin, single walled cardboard boxes as they won't protect your contents in transit.



Fill boxes completely

Ensure that boxes are filled completely so as not to leave any voids. Fill with soft bedding/towels, clothes or bubble wrap if necessary.



Fragile items

Ensure that all fragile items are individually wrapped in paper or bubble wrap to avoid breakages.



Electrical items

Where possible use original packing or otherwise ensure appropriate packing materials are used. Ensure all batteries and print cartridges are removed.
